



CAT BOX catalogue

The catalogue is organised by period.

Each item has a brief description. (5 items) indicates the number of objects and any information sheets, booklets, photographs, packs etc. in the box.

Each box will be listed as Small, Medium, Large, or Box+.

Small boxes

Up to 45cm x 35cm x 18cm (up to the size of a small/cabin suitcase). Can be carried with ease.

Medium boxes

Between 45cm x 35cm x 18cm to 59cm x 35cm x 33 cm (up to approximately the size of a medium suitcase). Single boxes can be carried by one person, but some might be awkward due to the size and shape of the box.

Large boxes

+59cm x 35cm x 33cm. Boxes are large and awkward. Heavy boxes which might require two people to move are highlighted.

Large boxes may be too large to fit in a small car, unless the seats fold down. This will be highlighted to you when you loan the boxes.

Some of the heavy boxes are extremely heavy. Whilst we can help you load into your vehicle you may need help unloading! This will be indicated to you when you book the loan.

Box+

These are larger loans containing a variety of KS3 appropriate books, archaeological handling material, replica items, and other material to support learning. A detailed list of the box contents is listed at the end of this document.

We currently have a Prehistory box and an Anglo-Saxon and Viking box available for loan. In the near future we hope to add a Roman box to the collection.
